


## Freshman Institute Campus Geilenkirchen

## The Freshman Institute is an integrated part of the FH Aachen - University of Applied Sciences, a public university

The Freshman program is the foundation/integration year (Studienkolleg) at the FH Aachen. It is a "soft landing" for international students: an ideal bridge between school in your home country and university studies in Germany. Students from all over the world live and study in small groups in an intercultural environment all on one campus.

Over 300 Freshmen successfully complete our program each year and begin to study at a German university.

The Freshman program lasts two semesters. It begins in October and ends in summer.

### Admission to the Freshman Program

- > Apply to an entrance exam online or in your home country or submit TestAS plus a language certificate
- > Basic proficiency in English or German required



### After the Freshman Program

Our team will guide you through the university application process and offer seminars on living and studying in Germany.

### Working in Germany

After completion of the Freshman program, students enrolled at German universities are permitted to work part-time. Upon completion of your degree, you may stay in Germany for up to 1½ years to find employment.
